#### CHALLENGE ACCEPTED

For the past fifteen years Camp Deerpark has hosted two specific fundraising events annually, a banquet in Pennsylvania in April and our Homecoming auction here at camp in September.

In September of 2018, inspired by a challenge match from the Norman & Elizabeth Hahn Family Foundation, the New York members of our Camp Deerpark family helped to raise more than \$22,000 toward our Promise Woods Children's Camp capital campaign. It was, at the time, the single biggest and most successful fund-raising activity ever experienced amid the New York City Mennonite churches.

In 2019 we celebrated our 50th anniversary. This time two New York City Mennonite church members stepped forward to provide a \$25,000 challenge match. The New York family more than doubled our efforts from the previous year with nearly \$58,000 being contributed to the ministry of Camp Deerpark.

It is the long-range goal of our board of directors to see the New York City churches continue to grow in our financial and volunteer support of Camp Deerpark. Currently, 72% of donations come from the state of Pennsylvania, 14% from New York, and 11% from other states. We are always encouraging our New York City community to find meaningful ways to support this ministry.

It was great to have a wonderful visit from the children, grandchildren, and great granddaughter of Pastor Celso and Zulma Jaime.



This was a great year for maple syrup at Camp Deerpark. Thanks to generous donations from several people we were boiling out of a new evaporator. The crew led by Kim McConaghay tapped 199 trees, collected 2198 gallons of sap, boiled for 91 hours, and produced 53.3 gallons of syrup, which has been enjoyed by hundreds.

#### A PLACE OF FINAL REST FOR THE NEW YORK CITY MENNONITE FAMILY

When Camp Deerpark was purchased in 1969 a portion of the land across from the chapel was designated as the Skinner family cemetery. At the time of purchase there was a verbal agreement that the Mennonites would care for the cemetery. In the early years Camp Deerpark installed a new fence and kept the area mowed. By the mid 1980's the cemetery was overgrown and the fence in bad repair.

Around 2007, Dale Stoltzfus, with the help of his family, took on the project of restoring the historic cemetery. By 2008 a new fence was installed, the stones were restored, trees and brush was removed, and grass replanted.

In 2015 when Hadassah Bontrager died, the Bontrager family buried her ashes in the Skinner/Camp Deerpark cemetery and marked the spot with a boulder that was taken from the property nearby.

In February 2021 the Camp Deerpark board acted to make the Camp Deerpark cemetery available to the members of Camp Deerpark owner churches, and others who have partnered in the ministry of Camp Deerpark, including former and current full-time staff, former and current donors, and former and current volunteers.

As an expression of our Anabaptist Christian faith, the Camp Deerpark Cemetery aims to reflect values of simplicity and stewardship. A management team of New York City Mennonite Church leaders and board members provide oversight.
