STAFFING TRANSITIONS


Kevin Smith, Operations Director

DEAR CAMP DEERPARK CONSTITUENTS,

Camp Deerpark has been a place of peace and renewal for all of us over the years. We all have sweet memories of meeting God and enjoying nature in this beautiful sanctuary. It is difficult to think that it could also be a place of conflict. However, conflict is part of doing life together, and from the Bible stories of Lot and Abraham all the way to Paul and Silas, we see that there are times that conflict reaches a breaking point where parties choose to part ways. In recent months, some situations arose that caused tension and dysfunction among the staff. The board spent time listening to all involved and, with the information that was presented, attempted to come to a resolution that would be acceptable to all. Unfortunately, we were not able to come to a conclusion that satisfied everyone, and some staff chose to resign from their positions at Camp Deerpark as a result of this process: Sean and Kim McConaghay, Kenton Baer, and Wendell and Carissa Baer.

Although our ultimate goal was biblical reconciliation, forgiveness, and restoration of relationships, there was miscommunication and hurt that occurred in this process and we fell short of that goal. We are saddened at the outcome, but we wish these staff the best as they venture into the next season of their lives. We would like to extend our deep gratitude to them for the time they spent at camp and their service to the Camp Deerpark community, and we are still praying for reconciliation and restoration of relationships in the future. Sean and Kim McConaghay served at camp for 17 years in the areas of maintenance, housekeeping, and construction, and also played an important role in making maple syrup each year. Kenton Baer, and Wendell and Carissa Baer have also been an integral part of the larger Camp Deerpark community for many years and have spent time as volunteers before being on staff in the areas of construction, maintenance, housekeeping, and weekend dining room support. We are so grateful for all of their contributions.

Since the departure of these valuable members of the Camp Deerpark staff, the board has examined the staff structure and some changes have been made. One of these changes is the addition of the role of Operations Director, a position that will focus on staffing and operations and will relieve some responsibilities from the Executive Director. We are excited to announce that Kevin Smith has agreed to become the Operations Director and made the transition from his previous role of Program Director in early October. We look forward to seeing Kevin continue to use his gifts at Camp Deerpark and anticipate the new ways that God may use him in this role.

With the loss of several staff and Kevin's transition to a new role, some critical roles at Camp Deerpark were empty, and we continue to see how "God is faithful" as he has provided for these needs. The Program Director role will be filled by Celmali Jaime Okonji, a former camper and summer staff member, who is also the daughter of Pastor Celso Jaime, the retired pastor of Evangelical Garifuna Church in the Bronx. Celmali currently lives in Kenya with her husband and children, so she will perform her duties primarily remotely during the year, and will travel to Camp Deerpark for the summer to direct the summer camp programs. We also are grateful that there have been several people who have stepped in to help with facilities and maintenance needs throughout the last few months and God continues to provide people to fill these needs.

We recognize there are many changes occurring in a short amount of time, and the board is available for any questions or concerns. Please feel free to reach out to any board member if there is something you would like to discuss. While this year has been very difficult for the staff and the board, we continue to see how God is faithful in bringing hope to difficult situations and making a way where there seems to be no way. Praise God with us for his provision in allowing Kevin to transition to a new role, and for the others who have been able to step in to fill vacant roles!
